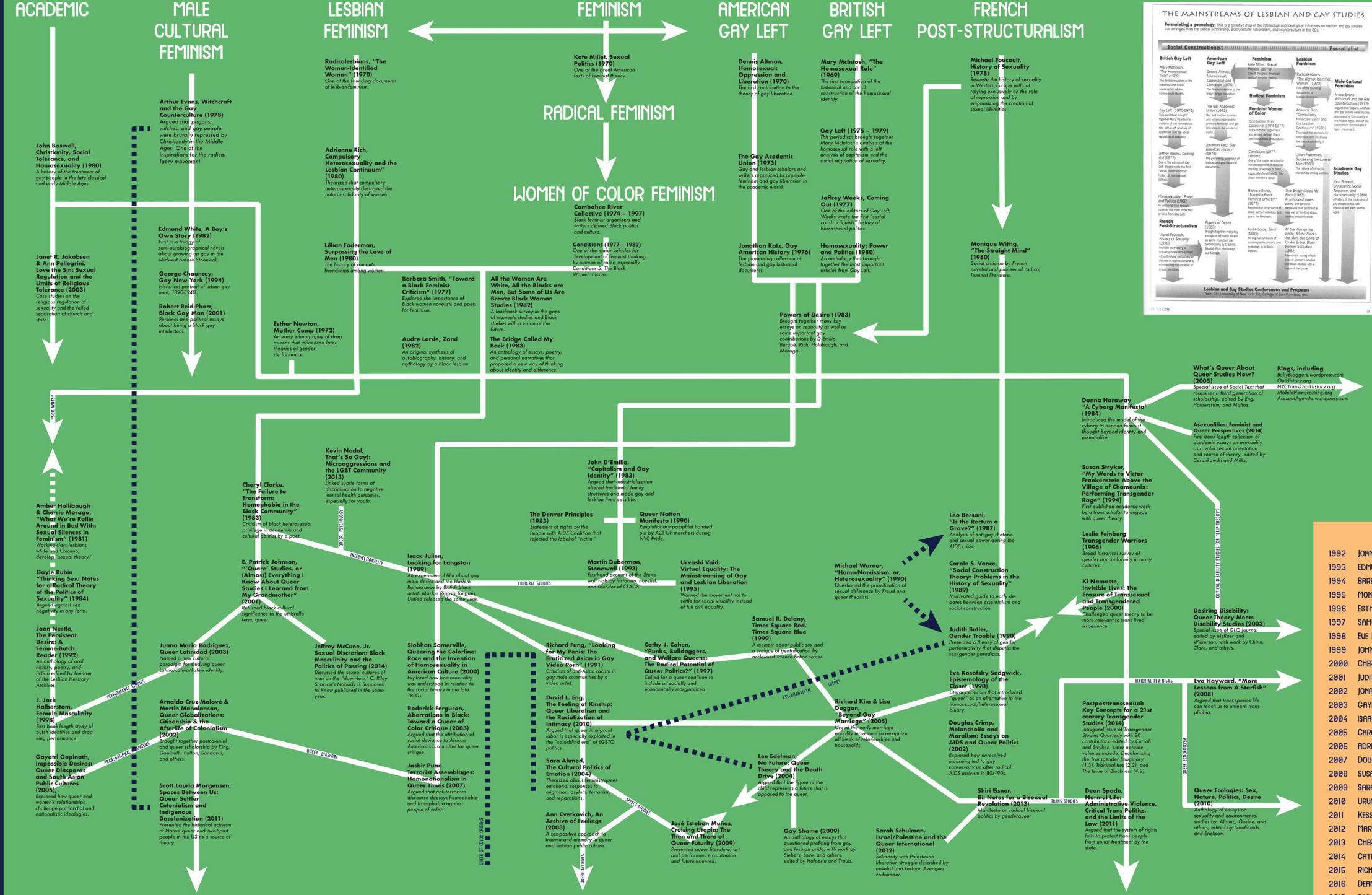
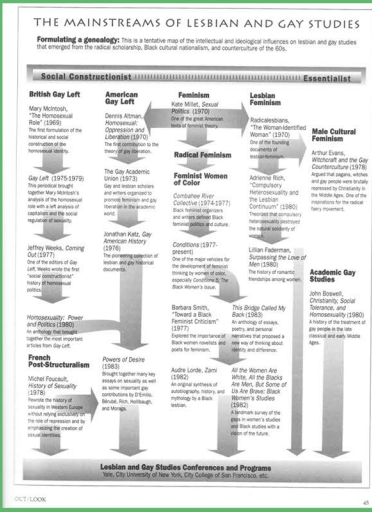


MAINSTREAMS OF QUEER STUDIES
